Dear Parishioners.

2023 has been a breakthrough year for us!

In February a group of parishioners went to the Divine Renovation Conference in Sydney and came back believing in the vision of a missional parish. We saw the focus on mission, the joy that the culture provides, and that people are out there interested in the Gospel.

The Mission Discernment Team has been meeting regularly, praying, and have almost completed committing to paper a vision and what that looks like in a parish like ours. Please pray for them that the Holy Spirit guides them to dream of what could be in our parish.

The Leadership Team meets regularly for breakfast and steers our decisions in line with mission.

The Parish Pastoral Council is forming as a team to strategise implementing the vision. Our big effort has gone into stepping up Alpha. Our primary evangelisation tool. It proposes the Gospel to the wider community in a compelling way and brings people to Jesus Christ.

We began an Alpha with a sit-down meal in April with 55 people completing. Many parishioners said it was life-changing for them. However, the focus is to invite people of no/little faith. This is the crucial role the parish plays – to invite others to come to Alpha. We are missional when we invite people of no/little faith to experience Alpha. We have also invited parents seeking sacraments for their children and non-Catholic parents wanting baptism for their children. The culture in Alpha is permeating into the parish. Several people have commented on this.

Two other Alphas have begun, in the Bell Block community and again at St Joseph's. It is amazing to see the guests accept the invitation and actually arrive! It is a joy to see so many parishioner volunteers, in teams, planning together, believing that the Holy Spirit will change people's lives. The power of teamwork and trust in the Holy Spirit is evident at Alpha.

Our Connect Groups are designed to be the follow-on from Alpha. Please take a prayer card from the church foyer and pray the Holy Spirit prayer for our parish every day. God bless the work.

CATHOLIC CHAPLAIN COMMISSIONING SERVICE FOR ALBERT CHOW: Last Friday Albert Chow was commissioned as the Catholic Chaplain at Te Whatu Ora (Taranaki Base Hospital). The service, led by Father Simon, took place at the Hospital Chapel. Joe Gray—Lead Chaplain and Team Leader of the hospital's Chaplaincy Services (pictured above with Albert) presented Albert with a candle, cross, bible, prayer book, holy water, pyx and hospital ID; all symbols representing Chaplaincy Ministry.

Albert says, "I was slightly taken aback by the 'formalities' of the Commissioning and the import of the Catholic Chaplain role dawned on me. St. Teresa of Avila's quote "Christ has no body on earth but yours" particularly hits home. I am however extremely grateful to know of the prayers and support from our faith community as I embrace this Ministry."

"Tabernacle" comes from the Latin 'tabernaculum' meaning tent, because the Ark of the Covenant, carrying God's sacred law, was carried by the Israelites in the desert in a tent. In the Christian Church, this sacred law is now fulfilled in Jesus Christ, who is present in the Holy Eucharist and this is often reserved inside the tabernacle.

Stained glass windows were first popularised in the 12th century to help those who could not read learn the stories they depict.

Inside the monstrance, the Holy Eucharist is held in a glass container called a 'luna' or 'lunette'.

At Holy Mass, and other times in the Church, westit to learn; we stand to show something exceptional is happening (such as during the reading of the Gospel), and we kneel to show reverence to God.
