Everyone is invited. Everyone!! We invite you and the whole parish, to be with us on Tuesday 12th March, 7.00pm at St Joseph's church for an evening with Fr Chris Ryan MGL.

Fr Chris is the parish priest of the Penshurst and Peakhurst parishes in Australia and the Director of the Arete Centre for Missionary Leadership. Fr Chris had the belief that the number one priority for the Catholic Church in Australia (and probably the same for us in New Zealand) ought to be the formation of leaders who are passionate about Jesus Christ and his mission. His belief led to the formation of the centre to form people as leaders in the Church's evangelising mission.

Fr Chris has practical experience and doctoral research in evangelisation and leadership formation. This work provides for a body of passionate, faith-filled, gifted and equipped leaders will emerge that can make an important contribution to the renewal of the Church. It is this background which brings Fr Chris to us on Tuesday. We are so fortunate to have him here with us in New Plymouth, even if it is for just one session. Do join us to listen to Fr Chris, talking about **The Case for Mission.** Learn how we can live a life of renewed witness and be inspired to help our parish bring people to Jesus. The evening begins in the church at 7.00pm with cake and a drink.

SPECIAL COLLECTIONS OVER EASTER: GOOD FRIDAY COLLECTION – 29 March 2024

The Holy Father's Good Friday Collection is a small gesture of solidarity for the Christian communities that still walk in the footsteps of Jesus. In 1342 the Apostolic See confirmed the Franciscans as the legitimate guardians of the Holy Land. Funds gathered by each country from the Holy Places Collection is forwarded to the Franciscan Custody of the Holy Land.

Our New Zealand collection is given for the upkeep of the Shrine Church in Cana, Galilee, and twenty University scholarships to Bethlehem University.

Please give generously to this collection in support of our brothers and sisters living in the land in which our Lord ministered.

COMMUNION ON THE TONGUE: Dear parishioners, the Liturgy Committee realises some people wish to receive communion on the tongue. The committee is conscious that Covid-19 is still in the Taranaki community and the element of fear associated with it still present. Please wait till the end of the communion procession to receive communion on the tongue, as the risk of spreading Covid-19 is greater when the communion minister's fingers come close to the mouth of communicants.

We are not required to attend liturgy on Good Friday, but we are encouraged to. The Good Friday Liturgy consists of 3 parts: the Liturgy of the Word, the Veneration of the Cross and Holy Communion. We are also encouraged to fast and abstain from eating meat on all the Fridays of Lent to honour Jesus who sacrificed His flesh for us on Good Friday.

It seems odd to refer to the day Jesus died as "Good". The term "Good" is an old English expression meaning 'holy'. But in another sense Good Friday is always tied to Easter Sunday, which is a joyful celebration of Jesus's resurrection. He could not have resurrected if He had not died.
