Dear Parishioners,

Ash Wednesday is this Wednesday! Hasn't that arrived in a hurry! This is because historically the date of Easter is based on the lunar cycle and still is. Lent begins with Ash Wednesday and is a season of joy. That is because we are preparing to celebrate the greatest feast on the Christian calendar - the passion, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. We typically prepare by taking up prayer, fasting and charity that we would normally not do. This is so we will be mindful that our conversion is never complete but is on-going. It is also the season of preparing to be baptised and/or renewing ones' baptismal promises at the Easter Vigil or on Easter Sunday. Some people are preparing to be baptised and/or received into the Catholic faith at the Easter Vigil and we journey with them recalling our own baptism. Lent is a 40 day journey and parallels the journey of Israel through the desert to the promised land and Jesus' time of temptation in the desert. Lent ends before the Mass of the Last Supper on Holy Thursday. The colours, environment and music over Lent all reflect the repentance and conversion called for over 40 days. COMMUNITY MEALS

On the 12 December Community Meals held the final meal for 2023. The theme was Christmas, and it certainly felt like everyone's Christmas had arrived.

There was plenty of food for everyone, ham, chicken (hot and cold) roast potatoes, roast vegetables, broccoli with cheese sauce, salads. There were many puddings; at least 4 pavlovas, Christmas mince tarts, Christmas cake, ice cream, fruit salad, meringues, cream, cakes, biscuits, muffins, chocolates, of course lollies and then the rest.

There were 60 giftbags, including our 10 anonymous ones. Deodorants, shampoo anything which we did not use in our giftbags went into the SVdP 'cupboard' to be added to the linen packs we are asked to provide to those most in need so your gifts will continue to provide happiness.

The journey to this meal started with a Parishioner explaining to me that the Parishioners of St Joseph Church and Our Lady Help of Christians Church (the whole parish of New Plymouth) would want to donate to the Community Meal and the gift bags. I was absolutely overcome by the generosity of spirit. It was the phone calls and emails to say they couldn't help on the day, but they'd drop off.... People would come up after Mass and donate money. The donation baskets were never empty.


