

THE FEAST OF THE ASSUMPTION OF OUR LADY is a Holy Day of Obligation and celebrated on August 15. It commemorates the belief that Mary, the Mother of Jesus, was taken body and soul into heaven at the end of her earthly life.

Early Christian traditions and writings reference the Assumption, and by the 8th century, it was widely celebrated. The doctrine was formally declared a dogma by Pope Pius XII in 1950. In New Zealand, apart from all Sundays throughout the year, there are two additional

MARRIAGE PREPARATION: We begin our Annual Mar-



GLORIA

• What Happens: On Sundays (outside of Advent and Lent) and solemnities, the Gloria is sung or recited. The priest or cantor intones the Gloria, and the congregation joins in singing or reciting this hymn of praise.



• Why We Do It: We have been asked for God's mercy and acknowledge the forgiveness from our Saviour. So now we are joyfully praising God for such wonderful gift. The Gloria is a hymn of praise that echoes the song of the angels at the birth of Christ. It expresses our joy and gives glory to God. Reference: (GIRM), 53,

2. COLLECT (OPENING PRAYER)

- What Happens: The priest prays the Collect, which collects the prayers of all gathered into one. The priest says, "Let us pray," followed by a moment of silence. This is the time that we can think in our mind what we want to pray for during this Mass. The priest on behalf of all the faithful offer our prayers to God then he prays the Collect aloud while the congregation remains silent.
- Why We Do It: This prayer sets the theme for the Mass and brings together the intentions of the congregation. It prepares the community for the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist. Reference: (GIRM), 54.

ROYAL COMMISION INTO ABUSE IN CARE:

Recently the Royal Commission into Abuse in Care presented its final report. Church leaders have publicly thanked the Inquiry for the work they have done in preparing this report. The Catholic bishops and congregational leaders acknowledge the Church's history and the ongoing trauma of those who have been harmed. Over the past 30 years, the Catholic Church in Aotearoa has made significant progress in responding to reports of abuse and safeguarding. Our focus on safeguarding and care is informed by the past and aims to ensure that people are safe in care today.

The Church takes all complaints of abuse seriously. Complaints against church personnel in New Zealand are refereed to the Church's National Office for Professional Standards (NOPS). Increased public discussion, such as with the Inquiry, can be the catalyst for people to come forward. We encourage anyone who has been abused by a priest or a religious to contact NOPS, for your story to be heard and your complaint to be investigated. Alternately you may choose to go directly to the Police, and the Church will support anyone who requires assistance to do this.


