Dinner in the hall to follow. Saturday morning - a keynote talk by Mons. Trevor Murray. There will be breakout sessions, presented by our ministry leaders to showcase and discuss their different ministries. Morning tea and lunch will be provided. The afternoon will finish with a prayer and sending forth in the Holy Spirit led by Bishop Michael Gielen. This will be a great event for our parish and for the parishes that join us.

Parishioners are invited but full registration (cost is \$85.00) is necessary in the first instance. If you do not register other options will become available in later months. Even if registrations are full, parishioners will be able to attend the keynote talks in St Joseph's Church.

1. INVITATION TO PRAYER

• What Happens: The priest invites the congregation to pray that the sacrifice may be acceptable to God. The priest says, "Pray, brothers and sisters, that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God, the almighty Father." The priest says "My sacrifice" because the priest stands in the person of Christ (known as *in persona Christi*) when celebrating the Eucharist. This means he acts as a representative of Christ, who is both the priest and the sacrifice in the Holy Mass. Just as Christ offered Himself on the cross, the priest offers the bread and wine, which will become the Body and Blood of Christ, on behalf of the Church. The congregation responds, "May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands for the praise and glory of his name, for our good and the good of all his holy Church."

Why We Do It: This invitation highlights the communal nature of the sacrifice and encourages the congregation to actively participate in the offering.

This prayer also highlights the priest's role is distinct from the congregation's, as he is the one ordained to perform the consecration and lead the liturgical offering. While the congregation offers their own sacrifices (symbolized by their prayers, daily struggles, etc.), it is the priest who offers the sacrifice of Christ's Body and Blood during the Mass. Thus, when the priest says "my sacrifice," he acknowledges his role in offering the Eucharist, acting on behalf of Christ and the Church. Reference: (GIRM), 146.

2. PRAYER OVER THE OFFERINGS

What Happens: The priest prays a blessing over the gifts of bread and wine, asking God to accept the gifts and transform them into the Body and Blood of Christ.

Why We Do It: This prayer

expresses our hope that God will accept our offerings and prepare us to receive the Eucharist. Reference: (GIRM), 77.





TO HOPE AND ACT WITH CREATION SEASON OF CREATION 2024

The firstfruits of hope (Rom 8:19-25)

Every year from the 1st of September to the 4th of October, Pope Francis encourages us to celebrate the Season of Creation. Every week during that month we encourage you to reflect on a quote from Pope Francis and take action.

15th September (24th Sun. in Ordinary Time) Season of Creation Māori Language Week 14-21 Sept "Creation is of the order of love. God's love is the fundamental moving force in all created things. (#77 Laudato Si')

Action: reflect on the rich kupu Māori *aroha* and its layers of meaning: sympathy, compassion, heart, openmindedness and generosity. *Aro+hā* literally means to follow the breath and implies an attentive care for self, other and world: to follow one's heart, going with the flow. You can use this karakia as a family during this Māori Language Week and might even try to learn it, noting the whakataukī within it *"aroha atu, aroha mai"*.

Kia hora te marino, kia whakapapa pounamu te moana, he huarahi mā tātou i te rangi nei. Aroha atu, aroha mai, tātou i a tātou katoa. Hui e! Tāiki e!

May peace spread before us, May the ocean glisten like greestone, a pathway for us all this day. Love flowing out, love flowing in, in respect for each other. Bind us all together!

There are two types of priests within the Catholic Church, religious and diocesan. Diocesan priests lead individual parishes. They serve the people within their , own parish and are not required to take the same vowels as religious priests.



Diocesan priests live on a monthly stipend and have their meals and lodging provided for them by the parish. Religious priests vow themselves to a religious order, such as the Jesuits. They wear particular religious garb and take additional vows of poverty and obedience. These Priests are unable to hold personal possessions and they own very little other than their clothes. They typically live in a community house alongside other members of the order. Typically they are not provided with a salary and must follow the orders of their superior.
