A huge thank you to Fr Chris Ryan from Australia for being with us last Tuesday night. Over 200 parishioners gathered at St Joseph's Church to listen to Fr Chris' message of Mission. One of the key messages was:

"The most important thing that's happening in our church today is the renewal of our parishes – where they become places that aren't focused on themselves but look out to others. We're healthiest not when we're looking inwards where everybody feels really cared for and happy and all their needs are being met, we're actually at our healthiest when we're reaching out to others, when we're looking out beyond ourselves to those who don't yet know the saving love of God."

PLANNED GIVING:

Just like any household, the parish has real-world costs. In addition to expenses for pastoral and liturgical activities, our weekly donations are needed to meet the parish costs of electricity, gas, rates, insurance and building maintenance, staff wages, and the priests food and groceries, vehicle running costs, Clergy Trust Fund contributions and much more.

And just like any household, to meet our living and running costs, the parish requires certainty of weekly income to cover parish costs.

An important way that all parishioners can help ensure stability of parish income is to personally commit to budget a set amount each week to donate to the parish. This is best done through a 'planned giving' approach. So how do you do this?

There are two ways to particate in planned giving.

- 1. Gift by **internet banking**. Set up a direct credit to the parish bank account 02-0630-0288002-97. You will need to advise Ireen at the Parish Office that you want to register for planned giving. When you set up your weekly payment (or your preferred payment frequency) you will need to provide your name, planned giving number and 'planned gift' in the payer details; or
- Use planned giving envelopes into which you place your weekly cash gifting. Place the envelope in the collection basket at Sunday Mass.

And don't forget you can claim 33% of your annual giving as a tax rebate from Inland Revenue. Search 'church donation tax credit' at www.ird.govt.nz on how to do this.

Our giving helps to ensure that the parish can meet its running costs and contributes to the wellbeing and vibrancy of parish life.

DONATIONS AND TAX RECEIPTS

31 March 2024 is not far away, and with it comes the end of the tax year. If you want to bring your giving up to date or make an annual donation before 31 March 2024, you will receive the tax rebate for this giving and be able to claim the 33% rebate tax. Donations can be put on the plate, brought into the office, or made online. Please contact the Parish Office for the bank details and references.

EMAILING TAX RECEIPTS: This year we will be emailing the tax receipts to donors. Tax receipts will be emailed to the email addresses we are using to send out the newsletter each Friday. If this is not the email address you would like the receipt to be sent to, please contact the Parish Office. And of course, if you would rather receive a printed copy, again please just let us know. We can easily issue printed receipts rather than emailed receipts.

SPECIAL COLLECTIONS

GOOD FRIDAY COLLECTION - 29 March 2024

The Holy Father's Good Friday Collection is a small gesture of solidarity for the Christian communities that still walk in the footsteps of Jesus. Our New Zealand collection is given for the upkeep of the Shrine Church in Cana, Galilee, and twenty University scholarships to Bethlehem University. In 1342 the Apostolic See confirmed the Franciscans as the legitimate guardians of the Holy Land. Funds gathered by each country is forwarded to the Franciscan Custody of the Holy Land.


Reconciliation is the reconciling of man to God. When we sin, we deprive ourselves of God's grace.


RITE II RECONCILIATION
