The Steering Committee continues to meet on a regular basis.

In our March update we advised that the CPNP has made a request to the Toi Foundation (formerly TSB Community Trust) for financial assistance for the position of Fund-raising Specialist. We are pleased to report that the Toi Foundation has generously granted the Parish \$15,000 towards the funding of the Fundraiser position.

The Steering Committee view the generosity of the Toi Foundation as the initial seeding for the important task of fundraising that is before us. Expressions of interest are now invited from parishioners who believe they have the skills, talents, and time to be considered for this key parish role. It is envisaged this will be a contracted part-time position for 2-3 years. The position will be competitively remunerated.

ANNUAL REPORT PRESENTATION: Thursday last week, we gathered in the church to meet with Bishop John and Liam Greer, General Manager of the Diocese of Palmerston North.

Bishop John began his delivery with these words. ..... "now when they heard this, they were pierced to the heart and said to Peter and the rest of the Apostles "Brothers and sisters, now what shall we do?" Acts 2.37. He spoke of our moving from an age of Christendom and of our need to be a Catholic Community and the part Divine Renovation could play in this change. The power of the Holy Spirit in making that change from maintenance to Mission Church. The three important words. Come Holv Spirit.

Liam spoke to us about the financial state of the diocese in relation to the annual return for 2022-2023, looking at Pastoral care, Advancing Education and the Common Good. He highlighted the challenges ahead, with a key focus on financial sustainability.

Mary's favorite flower. From the mysterious roses in Juan Diego's tilma which was imprinted with Mary's image, to the garland of roses she wore at La Sallette and the beautiful roses she brought to



Lourdes, Portman, Pellevoisin, Beauaing and Banneaux. It is said, every Hail Mary we say is like placing a rose at her feet.

Tower of David - The Tower of David was one of great strength and beauty and used for the defence of the city of Jerusalem during King David's reign. Mary is a symbol of the Tower because of the virtues she represented in beauty and strength. She defended and protected her Son, and continues to defend and protect us as we journey through life.
