In the Bible the four Evangelists have traditionally been depicted symbolically as creatures. A man (Mathew): his gospel begins with a long list of Jesus' forefathers. A lion (Mark): he begins his gospel with John the Baptist preaching like a roaring lion. An ox(Luke): an ox was a sacrificial animal such as the one Zechariah offered up in the temple. An eagle (John): his gospel begins with a bird's-eye view showing Jesus as the eternal Word.

You can often see these symbols in churches. For instance, many lecterns are adorned with the image of an eagle as a sign of the Word of God. The Old Testament was mostly written in Hebrew, and the New Testament was mostly written in Greek. The Spirit of God inspired the biblical authors from different times and places, to spread his message without error but in their own words. The Old Testament has many independently verified historical facts, however, not everything in the Bible is to be taken literally and it is the path God walks with his people that is more important. It is a message about God's love for His people.


The Church aided by the Holy Spirit, helps us to read the Bible well and to comprehend it in its entirety within the Tradition.
