DIVINE MERCY CHAPLET is a devotion that was revealed by God to St Faustina in Cracow, Poland in the 1930s. During the pontificate of Pope John Paul II, St Faustina's countryman, the devotion was given a special place in the life of the church when he designated the Second Sunday of Easter as Divine Mercy Sunday. A novena



leads up to this celebration. Brochures for the novena, which is a private novena, beginning Good Friday, are available in the church foyers.

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY DEVOTION: The Divine Mercy devotion will be held at Our Lady Help of Christians church Sunday 7 April at 2.30pm. There will be Rosary and Exposition followed by the Chaplet at 3.00pm. The Veneration of the Image will follow, finishing at approx. 3.15pm. Reconciliation will be available during this time. CONNECT GROUP: The Monday Connect Group which meets every Monday in the Parish Office to look at the weekly Gospel readings, is now starting at a new earlier time of 9.30am. Everyone is welcome to this group.



PLANNED GIVING:

Just like any household, the parish has real-world costs. In addition to expenses for pastoral and liturgical activities, our weekly donations are needed to meet the parish costs of electricity, gas, rates, insurance and building maintenance, staff wages, and the priests food and groceries, vehicle running costs, Clergy Trust Fund contributions and much more.

And just like any household, to meet our living and running costs, the parish requires certainty of weekly income to cover parish costs.

An important way that all parishioners can help ensure stability of parish income is to personally commit to budget a set amount each week to donate to the parish. This is best done through a 'planned giving' approach. So how do you do this?

There are two ways to particate in planned giving.

- Gift by internet banking. Set up a direct credit to the parish bank account 02-0630-0288002-97. You will need to advise Ireen at the Parish Office that you want to register for planned giving. When you set up your weekly payment (or your preferred payment frequency) you will need to provide your name, planned giving number and 'planned gift' in the payer details; or
- 2. Use **planned giving envelopes** into which you place your weekly cash gifting. Place the envelope in the collection basket at Sunday Mass.

And don't forget you can claim 33% of your annual giving as a tax rebate from Inland Revenue. Search 'church donation tax credit' at <u>www.ird.govt.nz</u> on how to do this.

Our giving helps to ensure that the parish can meet its running costs and contributes to the wellbeing and vibrancy of parish life.

BEQUESTS:

If at any time you are preparing a will, please consider the long-term needs of the parish.

As current parishioners we enjoy the use of Church facilities, be it at St Joseph's, Our Lady Help of Christians, Bell Block Mass Centre, or St Patricks, Okato. These facilities were funded by the past generations of parishioners.

All these buildings require ongoing maintenance and renewal of equipment.

Your bequest will be put to good use in helping to ensure we have well-maintained facilities for our communities, present and future, to worship and to continue to grow in faith and fellowship.



DONATIONS AND TAX RECEIPTS

31 March 2024 is not far away, and with it comes the end of the tax year. If you want to bring your giving up to date or make an annual donation before 31 March 2024, you will receive the tax receipt for this giving and be able to claim the 33% rebate tax this year. Donations can be put on the plate, brought into the office, or made online. Please contact the Parish Office for the bank details and references if you don't have a planned giving number.

EMAILING TAX RECEIPTS: This year we will be generally emailing the tax receipts to donors. Tax receipts will be emailed to the email addresses we are using to send out the newsletter each Friday. If this is not the email address you would like the receipt to be sent to, please contact the Parish Office. If you do not receive an emailed newsletter each week, it means we don't have your email address. And of course, if you would rather receive a printed copy, again please just let us know. We can easily issue printed receipts rather than emailed receipts.



The Steering Committee continues to meet on a regular basis. Feedback from the two parish consultation meetings held in June and July last year indicated general support for the concept plans, (as displayed in St Joseph's foyer) and are now adopted as the preferred solution for the parish. Various helpful comments on matters of detail were noted and will feed into the next phase of architectural plan refinement.

A positive letter of encouragement has been received from our new Bishop John following a presentation to him in New Plymouth in late October.

CPNP has made a request to the Toi Foundation (formerly TSB Community Trust) for financial assistance for the position of Fund-raising Specialist. It is envisaged this will be a contracted part-time position (24-32 hrs/wk) for 2-3 years. We expect to hear back from Toi Foundation mid-late April on the outcome of our request. A further Parish Centre Update will be provided at that time.
