Dear parishioners.

The journey from maintenance to mission is gaining traction. It is slow progress; however, we celebrate the wins. The vision is that our parish be filled with missional disciples of Jesus Christ, who are hungry for union with him and to bring others to the en-

counter with Jesus our friend and Lord. The prayers of those who are praying for the parish that our vision come to reality are appreciated. To the people who pray The Prayer to the Holy Spirit for our Parish everyday - thank you. To those ministers of intercession who pray for the parish mission at Holy Hour - thank you. To those who have been providing prayer support to the Mission Discernment Team (MDT) as they met every Wednesday - thank you. The MDT has completed its work. Two and a half years have passed since they first met to organise the parish culture and engagement survey. From which the parish vision was discerned, and the mission plan written. The team has identified through prayer and responses from the survey that the goals to be given priority for the remainder of the year are:

- Enrichment of parish prayer life. 1.
- 2. Welcomers and ushers (when required) to be developed at our Sunday Masses.
- 3. Homily improvement.
- 4. Youth minister support.
- 5. Young Family minister support.

The MDT has given the mission plan to the Parish Pastoral Council and disbanded. Thank vou to Shanon Stallard, Pip Hall, Roly Devine, Christina Chow, Susilo Kentiana, Fr Trung and previous members who put in the hours, sought the Holy Spirit and worked with joy. If you wish to obtain a paper copy, we will make copies available in the Parish Office. We will also place the plan onto the parish website.

On 22/23 November we will host an Open House for other parishes to come and see what we have been up to. We will share the journey with them and our learnings. The journey centers around the three keys of Evangelisation as primary, Leaning into the Holy Spirit, and Utilising the best of leadership.

To the visiting parishes we will provide a sit-down dinner in the hall Friday evening, and morning tea and lunch on the Saturday. Can you help with hospitality? We are going to need you! We are expecting at least 220 people! Please let the office know if you can help!

Bishop John Adams, Mons. Trevor Murray and Bishop Michael Gielen will be speaking to the gathering. It will be a great event for our diocese! God bless, Fr Simon.

The parish social justice group asks you to sign the petition in the foyer for an 'immediate and permanent cease-fire in Gaza' as Pope Francis has called for earlier this year.



The petition asks our council to call for a permanent ceasefire in Gaza, align their purchasing policy with UN resolutions and recognize Palestine. A ceasefire is about breaking the cycle of violence and suffering - it is the first step towards a lasting peace in Gaza and Israel.

Some of you might say 'Stay out of it'. Church should be apolitical". But that's not what the Gospels tell us. The petition has the support of our Bishop John and our Parish Priest Father Simon.

We pray for peace in the Holy Land E te Ariki We lift before you all the people of the Holy Land and ask for a restoration of a lasting and just peace in the land. We pray for the safety of aid workers and their families and for all people they come into contact with. Give grace to political leaders and authorities that they may seek lasting solutions that promote justice, peace and reconciliation.

1. Gospel Acclamation

- What Happens: A verse is sung, usually "Alleluia" (except during Lent), followed by a short scripture verse. The congregation stands, and the cantor or choir leads the Alleluia, with the congregation joining in.
- Why We Do It: The Gospel Acclamation is a joyful response to the Good News about to be proclaimed. It signifies our readiness to hear Christ's words.

2. Gospel

• What Happens: The deacon or priest proclaims a reading from one of the four Gospels. When they announce the Gospel reading, and the congregation responds, "Glory to you, O Lord," while making a small sign of the cross with their thumb on their forehead,

lips, and heart. This gesture is a form of silent prayer and devotion. It reflects the desire that the Word of God may impact the whole person—intellect, speech, and affections. After the reading, the congregation responds, "Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ."

• Why We Do It: The Gospels contain the life, teachings, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ, who is the centre of our faith. Listening to the Gospel helps us to encounter Christ.

3. Homily

- What Happens: The priest or deacon gives a sermon based on the readings. The homilist preaches from the ambo or another suitable place, helping the congregation understand and apply the readings to their lives. A homily must be given on Sundays and holy days of obligation during Mass and is to be reserved to a priest or deacon.
- Why We Do It: The homily interprets the scriptures and relates them to our daily lives, encouraging us to live out our faith more fully.

PROM POPE FRANCIS

The intention of Pope Francis for September. We pray that each one of us will hear and take to heart the cry of the Earth and of victims of natural disasters and climatic change, and that all will undertake to personally care for the world in which we live.

- * 3 popes were under the age of 25. The last was Pope Gregory V, who was 24 when elected in 996.
- * 7 were between 25 and 40 years old. The last was Pope Leo X, who was 37 in 1513.
- * 11 were between 41 and 50. The last was Pope Clement VII, who was elected in 1523 at the age of 44.
- * 24 popes were in their 50s. The most recent was Saint John Paul II, who was 58 years old when he began his papal ministry in 1978.
- * 37 were between 61 and 70 years old. The last was Pope John Paul I, who was 65 when he began his 33-day papacy in 1978.
- * Only three popes were over 80 when elected. The last, chosen by cardinals in 1406, was Pope Gregory XII. He was 81.


