AUSTRALASIA CONFERENCE 2023

Close to five hundred delegates from Australia and New Zealand came together recently in Sydney for the Divine Renovation Conference, including a team of five from our Parish. Divine Renovation is a movement, founded by Fr. James Mallon, on parish renewal.

The guiding statement of the Conference was "Called to Mission" and as Kevin Bailey – Executive Director of Divine Renovation Australasia said "this Conference will 'call us to more' and that is exactly the challenge we want to place before you. We want you to go back to your parishes as witnesses of what is possible and with a desire to commit yourselves to the task at hand."

In the coming weeks, we will be sharing with you what Divine Renovation is. What does Mission mean? What does the word evangelisation really mean? And what does all this mean for our Parish?

This week we're sharing some main points that stood out for the team:

- Meeting many people from all over Australasia with a thirst to know how.
- Realising it isn't that hard to learn new ideas and how to put them in place.
- For everyone to pray that our parish be led by the Holy Spirit.
- To setup pathways that meet people where they are on their faith journey.
- To help people into a committed relationship with Jesus Christ.
- To paddle (work and lead) the waka (our parish) upstream – otherwise we drift downstream with the culture.
- The church exists for mission it's not what we do but who we are.
- A parish is praying people with a purpose.
- The absolute privilege of being able to attend such a conference what a gift.
- Inspirational, motivating, energising, the positivity was contagious.
- Amazing speakers from Australia, NZ and Canada.
