On Mother's Day this year, Mum had a fall and was hospitalised for four days. She got 15 stitches on her head, but nothing serious happened with her brain. I thank God for the opportunity to visit my family back in my home country, Jakarta, Indonesia, from 17th June to 31st August 2023. This was five years after my last visit.

I spent most of the time with her. We talked and shared what had been happening with her. She is physically weak and needs someone to hold her when she walks. But she is in much better condition right now. Praise God! Mum is someone significant to me. She continues to play an important role in my faith journey.

This time, I also got a chance to sit down and hear the struggle my brother and his wife experienced with their children. I learned that my niece has depression, and my nephew has been diagnosed with ADHD (Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder). Hearing this brought a shock to my system.

I had many questions and wondered why it happened to my family and me. But I believe God allows terrible things to happen because He loves me. He stretches my heart, deepens my trust, and strengthens my faith.



I stopped asking, "WHY DID THIS THING HAVE TO HAPPEN WITH ME?" to God; instead, now I am asking, "WHAT DO YOU WANT ME TO LEARN FROM THIS?" I put my trust to the all-known God.

Besides the struggles, I also had a great time visiting friends and eating all the food I couldn't find here in New Zealand,

Spirit leads me where my trust is without borders.

Let me walk upon the waters.

Wherever You would call me
Take me deeper than my feet could ever wander.

And my faith will be made stronger.

especially my home food. It was a great time, and my heart was full. Not only my heart but my tummy was also full.

At the end of my trip, I had an opportunity to meet my brothers and sisters at the ICPE Mission, the international community I belong to. There were about 200 people gathered for the community gathering.

I was blessed to meet Archbishop Julian, the Archbishop of Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia, where he shared the possibility of running a School of Evangelisation for young people in Kuala Lumpur. The Archdiocese has given us a house that we can use to run the school.



Of the seven sacraments only one is called the Blessed Sacrament. In all of the sacraments God gives us grace, that is his own life. But in the sacrament of the Eucharist, God IS the sacrament. We see bread (the host), but it is the Body of Christ. Therefore we give the Eucharist the same honour we would if God himself were in front of us. After celebrating the Eucharist, the Body of Christ is preserved in the tabernacle. As a sign of the continuous and living presence of Jesus a candle or lamp burns there day and night. Every time we pass, we genuflect towards the tabernacle to honour Jesus present there. Liturgical practices such as genuflections to, and adoration of, the Blessed Sacrament - whether exposed in the monstrance upon the alter or reserved in the tabernacle- teach us that this is no mere symbol or reminder of Gods presence, but in reality God present in the most Holy Eucharist.

Anytime spent before the Blessed Sacrament is but a fragment of God's gift of time to us. We adore Jesus in the Eucharist by quietly being with him: He looks at you and you look at him. You can tell him everything.
