prayers, and rituals handed down through the centuries. However, it can sometimes be challenging to fully grasp the significance of these elements and their connection to God and to each other.

This week we will begin to look at some of the **Introductory Rites**:

Entrance: The priest and ministers enter the church and proceed to the altar.

Greeting: The priest greets the Congregation (people).

Penitential Act: The congregation acknowledges their sins and asks for mercy.

Kyrie: A prayer for mercy.

Next week we will continue to look at the Introductory Rites:

Gloria: A hymn of praise (omitted during Advent and Lent).

Collect: The Opening Prayer.

A Journey in Faith

Saint John Vianney, a French parish priest born on May 8, 1786, overcame academic challenges to be ordained in 1815. Assigned to parish of Ars in 1818, he transformed the parish with his holiness and preaching, spending up to 16 hours a day hearing confessions and attracting pilgrims. Known for his humility, simple lifestyle, and devotion to the Eucharist, he also had a deep devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary and St. Philomena. Canonized in 1925, he is the "Patron Saint of Parish Priests" and is celebrated on August 4. Vianney's legacy continues to inspire, emphasizing confession, the Eucharist, and pastoral care.



1. Entrance Procession

- What Happens: The priest, and altar servers process (walk) to the altar while a hymn is sung. The procession starts at the back of the church and moves towards the altar. The congregation (people) stand and sing the entrance hymn, joining in the joyful atmosphere.
- Why We Do It: The procession symbolises the journey of the faithful toward the heavenly banquet. The hymn helps to unify the congregation and sets a joyful tone for the celebration.

Reference: The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM), 120.

2. Greeting

- What Happens: The priest greets the congregation with words like "The Lord be with you," and the congregation responds. The priest stands at the altar or in front of the congregation, raises his hands, and says the greeting. The congregation responds, "And with your spirit."
- Why We Do It: This exchange is a biblical salutation (greetings) that serves to acknowledge the presence of Christ among the people and fosters a sense of community.

3. Penitential Act


- What Happens: The congregation confesses their sins and asks for God's mercy. The priest invites the congregation to reflect on their sins, and the congregation may say the Confiteor ("I confess to Almighty God...") or another form of penitential prayer, followed by the Kyrie Eleison ("Lord, have mercy").
- Why We Do It: This act of repentance prepares the hearts of the faithful to participate in the sacred mysteries with a humble and contrite spirit. It also reminds us of God's mercy and forgiveness.

Reference: (GIRM), 51-52.

4. Kyrie Eleison (Lord, have Mercy)

- What Happens: The congregation sings or recites "Lord, have mercy; Christ, have mercy; Lord, have mercy." The priest or cantor leads the Kyrie, and the congregation responds, typically in a call-and-response format.
- Why We Do It: The Kyrie is an ancient prayer asking for God's mercy. It is a continuation of the Penitential Act and emphasises our need for God's grace. Reference: (GIRM), 52.


