# CHILDREN'S LITURGY

CHILDREN'S LITURGY AT ST JOSEPH'S CHURCH 9AM MASS: Children's Liturgy is starting up again at St Joseph's Church during 9am Mass. We haven't had Children's Liturgy since before Covid so we are really excited!

This is all thanks to Rachel Ammunsden who has volunteered is this act of service for the young families in our parish. Rachel is a primary school teacher and has many years of experience at taking Children's Liturgy.

This will start on Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> February. Children's Liturgy is for children under about eight years old who have not yet made their First Communion. Children under three years old are welcome but we do ask a parent accompanies them please.

The priest will call those children who wish to go to Children's Liturgy up to the altar after the opening prayers. They will receive the light of Christ and the Children's Lectionary and head out to the foyer with Rachel.

A typical Children's Liturgy session will be based around the Gospel reading of the day. There will be discussion and usually some sort of activity that they may start. Depending on time the children may then bring this activity home to finish.

The group will come back in to find their families about offertory time. There will be, of course, some Sundays when Rachel is unavailable and Children's Liturgy won't take place. Children's Liturgy will not take place when we celebrate a School led Mass. Please contact me if you have any further questions. # **WAITANGI DAY**

Tues 6 Feb

Our national day commemorating the first signing of the Treaty of Waitangi – Te Tiriti o Waitangi, in 1840.

'Because of the Christian involvement in its signing and the Church's mission to bring about a better world we can mark Waitangi as a significant spiritual event and a time to pray for the land and its peoples. We can give thanks for the gift of being here, ask forgiveness for the wrongs of our history from which some have benefitted and some have lost, and re-commit ourselves to work for a more just society.'

Ordinary Time has a deeper

meaning.

Drawing on the root word of ordinary, this is a time when we are ordering our life towards God. We are putting order into our days. The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd refers to this as the "growing time". Green vestments are worn during this liturgical season with the color green being the symbol of hope and victory, but also new life and growth. We are growing in our relationship with God.

And so the Church provides for us this time of growth. We have been given special gifts during the Advent and Christmas seasons, and now it is a time to put these gifts into action. We are seeking God in our usual ordinary walk of life. This is a time for us to live as Christians, guarding and strengthening the life received at Baptism. We deepen our relationship as children of God, and fulfill our purpose as 'alter Christus' (another Christ) and look forward to His Final Coming. We are contemplating, entering deeper into the mystery of Christ as revealed through this unchanging, customary and ordered Ordinary liturgical Time of the Year.





