# Jubilee Year 2025

**Pilgrims of Hope** 

Pope Francis has declared 2025 as a year of Jubilee with the theme 'Pilgrims of Hope'. This gives voice to his desire for the year to foster a greater sense of global sisterhood and brotherhood, solidarity with the poor, and caring for the environment. It will be a year of hope for a world suffering the impacts of war, the ongoing effects of COVID-19 pandemic, and economic and climate crises.

The Jubilee Year, or Holy Year, is a significant event in the Catholic Church, traditionally observed every 25 years. This special year is a time for spiritual renewal, dedicated to encouraging the faithful to embark on pilgrimages, to repent forf their sins, to forgive others, to commit to acts of charity and to renew their focus on spiritual life.

# Important Dates

During the coming week our new priest, Fr Sobin Sebastian will arrive and will be celebrating Mass during that weekend. Please welcome Fr Sobin to our community and pray for his time here with us.

Sunday 2 February We open the Jubilee Year 2025 Pilgrims of Hope, here at the Catholic Parish of New Plymouth.

The term "Jubilee" originates from the Hebrew word *yobel*, referring to the ram's horn used to announce the start of the jubilee year in Jewish tradition. The idea of joy and liberation associated with this celebration inspired its adoption into Catholic practice. The Jubilee Year is seen as a time to reset spiritually, embrace forgiveness, and embark on a path of hope. It dates back to biblical times, drawing inspiration from the ancient Jewish tradition described in the Book of Leviticus, where a jubilee year was celebrated every 50 years. During this time, debts were forgiven, slaves were freed, and land was restored to original owners, symbolising renewal and liberation.

Pope Boniface VIII proclaimed the first Catholic Jubilee in 1300. The frequency of Holy Years has changed over time: At first, they were celebrated every 100 years; later, in 1343 Pope Clement VI reduced the gap between Jubilees to every 50 years, and in 1470 Pope Paul II made it every 25 years. There have also been "extraordinary" Holy Years. In 1933 Pope Pius XI chose to commemorate the 1900<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Redemption, and in 2015 Pope Francis proclaimed the Year of Mercy as an Extraordinary Jubilee, marking the 50th anniversary of the closing of the Second Vatican Council. The way in which Jubilee Years are marked has also changed through the centuries: The practice has since evolved, becoming a cornerstone of the Church's efforts to promote faith and reconciliation.

Jubilees are designed to be a time of conversion and increased emphasis on God's mercy and forgiveness of sins. They are marked by the opening of the Holy Door in St Peter's Basilica in the Vatican. The Holy Doors, present in each of the four papal basilicas in Rome, are destination points for pilgrims who travel to Rome during a Jubilee and who pass through seeking special graces and outpourings of God's mercy.

On 9 May 2024, Pope Francis published his Papal Bull for Jubilee 2025, *Spes non confundit; Hope does not disappoint*, setting out the details of this Jubilee Year. "We must fan the flame of hope that has been given us and help everyone to gain new strength and certainty by looking to the future with an open spirit, a trusting heart and far-sighted vision." The Jubilee "can contribute greatly to restoring a climate of hope and trust as a prelude to the renewal and rebirth that we so urgently desire," he added. "That is why I have chosen as the motto of the Jubilee, *Pilgrims of Hope*."

The Jubilee of 2025 for the Universal Church began on December 24, 2024, with the Opening of the Holy Door of Saint Peter's Basilica. Pope Francis invites us to embrace this hope, grounded in the unshakable love of God, as a source of strength and perseverance. During this special year, the Church encourages a deepening of faith through pilgrimage, prayer, the sacrament of Reconciliation, and works of mercy. These practices embodying mercy, healing, and renewal-offer us a path of conversion, reconciliation, and service, helping to renew our commitment to love, compassion, and faith. Join us as we walk this sacred journey, embracing the transformative power of God's mercy and the hope that never diminishes.

The Jubilee Year in the Diocese of Palmerston North will open Sunday 2nd February. If you are in Palmerston North or wish to travel to Palmerston North for this Mass, you are most welcome.



The Jubilee Year will be opened in the Catholic Parish of New Plymouth the same day, 2 February with ceremony at the Sunday Masses.

ADORATION: Next Thursday we recommence adoration at St Joseph's on Thursday evenings between 7.00pm and 8.00pm.

As a Eucharistic minister, parishioner Maria Bushell has been commissioned in our Parish with a special blessing to assist in the provision of adoration. With assistance from Maria, adoration will still take place in the event a priest is not available. There would be no Ben-



ediction on these occasions. Please come and join us. Thursdays at 7.00pm. A cup of tea and fellowship will follow and everyone is welcome.

Adoration will resume at Bell Block Mass Centre, First Friday of February, 4.00pm 7 February. Adoration at Our Lady Help of Christians will resume within the next few weeks. This will be announced in the newsletter.

#### The Jubilee Logo

The logo shows four stylized figures, representing all of humanity, coming from the four corners of the earth. They embrace each other to indicate the solidarity and fraternity which should unite all peoples.

The figure at the front is holding onto the cross. It is not only the sign of the faith which this lead figure embraces, but also of hope, which can never be abandoned, because we are always in need of hope, especially in our moments of greatest need.



There are the rough waves under the figures, symbolising the fact that life's pilgrimage does not always go smoothly in calm waters. Often the circumstances of daily life and events in the wider world require a greater call to hope. That's why we should pay special attention to the lower part of the cross which has been elongated and turned into the shape of an anchor which is let down into the waves.

The anchor is well known as a symbol of hope. In maritime jargon the 'anchor of hope' refers to the reserve anchor used by vessels involved in emergency manoeuvres to stabilise the ship during storms. It is worth noting that the image illustrates the pilgrim's journey not as an individual undertaking, but rather as something communal, marked by an increasing dynamism leading one ever closer to the cross.

The cross in the logo is by no means static, but it is also dynamic. It bends down towards humanity, not leaving human beings alone, but stretching out to them to offer the certainty of its presence and the security of hope. At the bottom of the logo is the motto of the 2025 Jubilee Year: Pilgrims in hope, (Peregrinantes in Spem) represented in green letters.


#### SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION
