OUR NEW PARISH VISION

A COMMUNITY CALLED BY GOD FOR MISSIONAL DISCIPLESHIP GATHERED AROUND JESUS CHRIST FED WITH THE EUCHARIST AND SENT TO TRANSFORM LIVES EMPOWERED BY THE HOLY SPIRIT



1. PROFESSION OF FAITH (CREED)

• What Happens: The congregation recites the Nicene Creed or the Apostles' Creed. The Apostles' Creed is a more concise and ancient statement of faith, while the Nicene Creed is a more detailed formulation developed to affirm specific theological points about the Trinity. The priest invites the congregation to profess their faith, and all together recite the Creed.

The Apostles' Creed is older, dating back to the early Christian Church around the 2nd century. It includes core Christian beliefs such as belief in God the Father, Jesus Christ as the Son of God, the Holy Spirit, the Church, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and eternal life. We usually recite The Apostles' Creed during Lent and Easter.

The Nicene Creed was formulated later, during the First Council of Nicaea in 325 AD and later expanded at the First Council of Constantinople in 381 AD. More elaborate, with additional emphasis on the nature of Christ and the Holy Spirit. It explicitly states that Christ is "begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father," and elaborates on the role of the Holy Spirit in the life of the Church.

• Why We Do It: The Creed is a summary of our Christian beliefs. Reciting it together reaffirms our faith and unity as a community of believers.

2. PRAYER OF THE FAITHFUL (UNIVERSAL PRAYER)

• What Happens: The congregation prays for various intentions, including the Church, the world, the local community, and those in need. The deacon, lector, or another designated person reads the intentions, and the congregation responds with a set phrase like, "Lord, hear our prayer" or here in our Parish we sing - E te Ariki whakarongo mai rā ki a mātou.

During this time, along with the universal prayer, we should also reflect on our personal intentions for the Mass at the time of the Collect and offer them again.

• Why We Do It: The Universal Prayer reflects our role as the Body of Christ, interceding for the needs of the Church and the world.

Last Saturday evening during the vigil Mass at Our Lady Help of Christians, Tony Tooman was presented with the Benemerenti Medal. This is an award from the Pope to persons, to recognise their service to the Church. This award acknowledges the 18 years of dedication Tony gave to Catholic hospital chaplaincy.

Tony's family were present for the award as well as for the baptism of his granddaughter Charlotte at that Mass. Joe Grey was also present to support Tony. Joe was the hospital chaplain for the whole hospital for the last 7 years of Tony's chaplaincy. Joe has also retired from the hospital chaplaincy. REVIEW OF END OF LIFE CHOICE ACT: The End of Life Choice Act 2019 is the law that makes assisted dying legal in New Zealand. The Act came into force on 7 November 2021, following a public referendum held alongside the 2020 General Election. The Act is administered by the Ministry of Health. Under the legislation, the Ministry of Health must undertake a review of the operation of

by the Ministry of Health. Under the legislation, the Ministry of Health must undertake a review of the operation of the Act within 3 years of it coming into force, and every 5 years after that. Public consultation for feedback on the End of Life Choice Act is now open.




