a line from Psalm 71 ("Do not cast me off in my old age" -- as the theme for the 2024 celebration of the World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly. (We actually read Psalm 71 at Mass today Wednesday 24 July)

Cardinal Kevin J. Farrell, prefect of the Dicastery for Laity, the Family and Life, said the theme is a reminder "that, unfortunately, loneliness is a widespread reality, which afflicts many elderly people, often victims of the throwaway culture and considered a burden to society." Families and parishes, he said, "are called to be at the forefront in promoting a culture of encounter, to create spaces for sharing, listening, to offer support and affection: thus, the love of Gospel becomes concrete".

MARRIAGE PREPARATION: We begin our Annual Marriage Preparation course; Love is a Decision in August. This is a 90 minute group gathering, led by Steve



https://cpnp.infoodle.com/f/ MarriagePreparationRegistration For the Jews a plentiful supply of oil, along with corn and wine, was a sign of God's favor. Oil was, and still is, a sign of God's blessing because it represents all that is best in life, God's generosity to the people He loves.



As a symbol, oil reminds us of God's boundless generosity towards us, and of His never-ending love of us. When we use it to anoint people in Church, it is more than merely a symbol, or reminder. It becomes one of the channels by which God's power comes into the world, by which He blesses us with His Holy Spirit.

Oils used for anointing are specially blessed for this purpose by the Bishop at the Chrism Mass in Holy Week, so called because one of the oils used is called 'Chrism.'


Oil of the Catechumens is the oil used during baptism; it is believed to strengthen the one being baptized to turn away from evil, temptation and sin. The catechumen is someone who is preparing to become a Christian through baptism and is anointed as a symbol of being the heir of the Kingdom of God, as kings and queens were anointed at coronations, and empowered for their Christian life and as prophets were anointed for their ministry.

Oil of Catechumens helps strengthen the person about to be baptised, and prepare them for the struggle of the Christian life, the way a wrestler in ancient Greece and Rome was anointed before a wrestling match.

Anointing at Baptism is a symbol which points to the gift of the Holy Spirit, which comes to the newly baptised person as it did upon Christ at His Baptism in the Jordan. In Baptism we are "born of water and the Spirit" (John 3:5), the Holy Spirit which is the gift of Christ to His Church.

At our Baptisms this Sunday the children will be anointed with the Oil of Catechumen as part of the baptism ceremony.

Adults are welcomed into the Church through a gradual process of formation in the teachings of the faith, life in the community, liturgy, prayer and ministry. This process is called *RCIA* (*Rite for the Christian Initiation of Adults*). It involves regular meetings over the course of a year and culminates with Baptism at the Easter Vigil.



RCIA provides an opportunity for adults to discern a lifelong *relationship* with Jesus. This culminates in Baptism where one says YES to this divine *relationship*.
