TEXT SCAM ALERT: It has come to our attention that there have been numerous scam text messages circulating recently. The latest scam involves a text from a US phone number pretending to be one of our Diocesan priests and requesting money. If you receive such a text, you can report it to the Department of Internal Affairs by forwarding the message to 7726 (free of charge). You will then receive a text response asking for the scammer's phone number to complete the report. Once you've done the report you can block the number and delete the text. Please be vigilant about email scams as well. Always check the sender's address carefully and never reply to suspicious emails. And remember that our priests, parish and Diocesan staff will never text or email you asking for money! If you are ever in doubt, call the person directly to verify their identity.
