The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) emphasizes the importance of human freedom and the consequences of mortal sin (CCC 1861). It serves as a vital resource for Catholics to deepen their faith and understanding. The CCC is a comprehensive exposition of Catholic doctrine. It covers beliefs, sacraments, commandments, and prayers, providing a detailed guide for understanding the faith.

Canon Law is the internal legal system that governs the day-to-day workings of the Catholic Church. It is essential for maintaining order within the Church, much like bylaws in other organizations. Canon Law, encompasses a comprehensive system of laws rather than individual laws. This legal framework has developed organically over centuries, rooted in Scripture and tradition. It helps the Church formulate and practice its faith coherently. Canon Law is crucial for the Church's mission, ensuring stability and order, much like the Ten Commandments did for the Israelites.

The GIRM, or the **General Instruction of the Roman Missal**, is a document that provides specific guidelines on how the Mass is to be celebrated. It details the liturgical norms and instructions for the celebration of the Eucharist, ensuring uniformity and reverence in the liturgy. According to *Sacrosanctum Concilium* 22.3, "no other person, even if he be a priest, may add, remove, or change anything in the liturgy on his own authority." The GIRM is crucial because it helps maintain the integrity and unity of the Mass across the global Church.


