## Life Teen Summer Camp at Keswick Christian Camp, Rotorua

From the 10th of January until the 14th of January 2026, 16 of our teenagers attended Life Teen Summer Camp at Keswick Christian Camp, Rotorua.

At camp, our teenagers learned how to discover enduring hope in Christ through the example of Mary. Across several sessions—Hope in Surrender, Obedience, Darkness, and Love—it combined games, worship, teaching, Scripture, and small-group reflection to show how trust in God transforms fear, suffering, and uncertainty into hope. Mary is presented as a relatable model whose faith, obedience, and love anchor hope even in hardship, especially at the Cross. I pray that our teenagers become the bearers of radiant hope in their daily lives.

## LITURGICAL POSTURE:

The Catholic Diocese of Palmerston North is embarking on a discussion about liturgical posture, with a focus on the Eucharistic Prayer at Mass. We know that as Catholics we pray with our bodies. If we are standing or kneeling, sitting or bowing, seeing, hearing or touching, all of these actions have significance in our prayer, particularly at Mass.

Bishop John is inviting every parish to take part in a diocesan-wide process of reflection on the significance of our bodily posture during the liturgy – particularly during the Eucharistic Prayer. The Council of Priests of the diocese has asked Bishop John to decide how we, as a diocese, might adopt a common posture, and our participation in these discussions is an important part of that discernment.

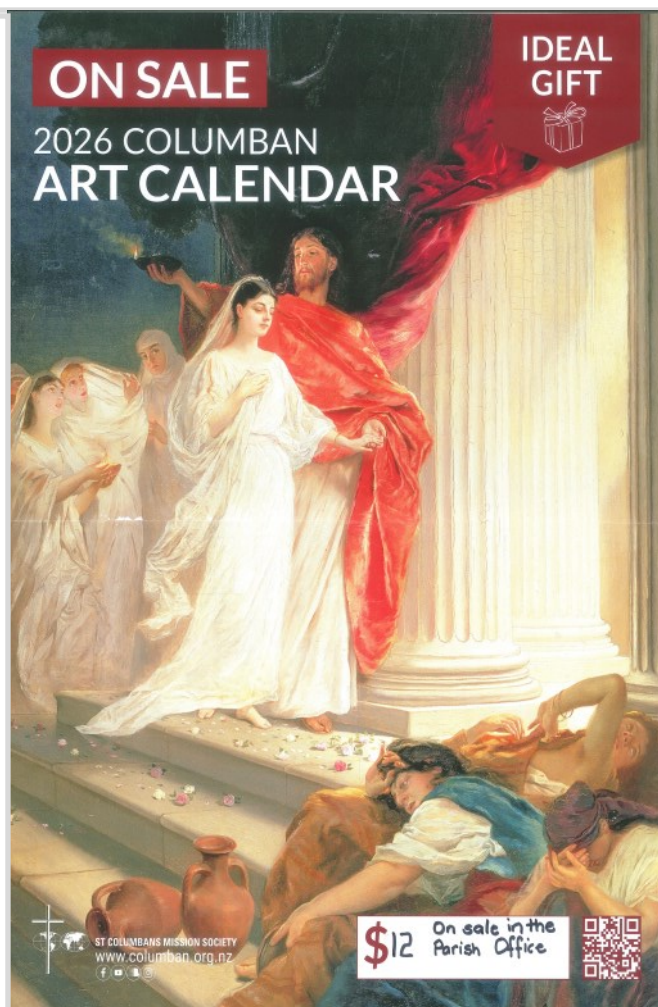

### STATEMENT FROM THE BISHOP OF PALMERSTON NORTH

The Diocese of Palmerston North has recently been made aware of information concerning the past involvement of an individual, Callun Fieldes (also known as Callun Leo Andrew Signal), with youth activities in the Catholic Parish of New Plymouth during the period 2014–2015.

It is now publicly known that this individual has since been convicted and sentenced by the courts for serious sexual offences against children. Those matters have been addressed through the criminal justice system.

At the time of Mr Fieldes reported involvement with parish activities, Safeguarding requirements and procedures were not as advanced as they are today. There is no record of any complaint or disclosure made to the Diocese or the parish in relation to his conduct during that period.

The Diocese is treating this information with care and seriousness. While no specific allegation relating to parish activities has been received, it is important that anyone who may have relevant information, concerns, or who has been affected in any way feels supported to come forward.
