JUBILEE CELEBRATION OF 50 YEARS OF PRIESTHOOD: In May 1975, in various churches (Stratford. Pungarehu, St Joseph's NP) 3 young Taranaki men, were ordained into priesthood. Last Sunday the three, Mons Brian Walsh, Fr Brian Vale, of St Columban Mission Society and Fr Tom Lawn, celebrated 50 years of priesthood at St Joseph's church. Nearly 400 people gathered for Mass on a glorious autumn afternoon, and after Mass retired to the hall for Fr Tom's famous donuts and Fr Tom's even more famous punch (47 litres of punch were consumed) plus other delicious goodies. It was such a wonderful afternoon. Congratulations our Three Taranaki Jubilarians.

We have reproduced with permission the homily of Fr Tom. He said

"Looking at the decades this is how it was for me:

The 70's -Learning how to live with the privilege and power of the priesthood. Inspirational priests and religious sisters and brothers helped me to keep at the forefront of my mind that Jesus came to serve and not be served, to save and not to condemn.

The 80's—the privilege and challenge of living in another culture and language and church. Discovering the destructive power of colonisation for indigenous people and our church's stated commitment to them, my ignorance of Te Ao Maori finally sunk in. Learning that Jesus is a liberator and has a preferential option for the poor.

The 90's—Learning how to be an instrument of God's love back home. Enjoying the unifying power of the Passionist Family Groups and discovering the healing power of Rite 3 of Reconciliation. Trying unsuccessfully to come to grips with Te Reo.

The 2000's—Consolidating the learnings of the 90's, encouraging people to attend Mass, to belong to a small faith group, and to have a ministry or apostolate. Discovering that our Bishops listened to Rome more than our people, Rite 3 celebrations were stopped. Focusing on Jesus as brother and friend.

The 2010's—Becoming aware of treading water and the energy sapping power of aging. Discovering my blindness about victims of sexual power and abuse. I had prayed for the abusers but hadn't for the victims. Finally knowing in my heart that I just wanted to serve pastorally, going to meetings was no longer energising

2000's— Happy to be here, happy to serve and bring hope, happy to be reminded and remind that Jesus is the liberator of the poor, relishing being Jesus's companion, ready to walk along side His Body here on earth, and on a good day ready to stand up for all those God has given life to.

Its been a great ride, a bit bumpy at times, but mostly gentle and occasionally exciting. Thank you" Tom.

JUSTICE AND PEACE GROUP: On Monday 12 May 2025, at Our Lady Help of Christians Church, the Justice and Peace Group hosted a talk by Columban Missionary Priest (and also Jubilarian) Fr Brian Va-



le on "Where I feel the Spirit is Leading us as peacemakers" Fr Brian said Peace-making involves areas such as; Spirituality, Advocacy, Education, Dialogue, Communications, Finance and Investment, Leadership and Networking. He shared his own experience in the Justice and Peace Ministry in Japan with issues such as the nuclear issue, peace-making with Buddhist groups and work against discrimination. Fr Brian invited de La Salle Brother Peter Bray to share of his experiences of 15 years as Vice Chancellor of Bethlehem University and of the plight of Palestinians in the current tragic situation. Br Peter highlighted the history and the current situation through the personal stories of Palestinian students at Bethlehem University. Sister Lidwina Van Beers RNDM shared her peace making experiences working against violence to women, and others in Papa New Guinea. Fr Brian shared his own experience about speaking and listening to the Spirit in Nature, especially with trees. He felt The Spirit is leading us to be courageous, be strong advocates for peace through marches and letter writing and by tapping into our Inner depths where The Spirit speaks to us in these difficult times.






