





RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS (RCIA)



The Rite of Election and **the Call to Continuing Conversion** mark significant milestones for those preparing to be baptised (Catechumens) and those preparing to be received into full communion (Candidates) in the Catholic Church. During **the Rite of Election**, those seeking Baptism write their names in the Book of the Elect, which lists those who have been chosen for the sacraments of initiation. Meanwhile, those already baptised, who seek full communion in the Church, participate in **the Rite of the Call to Continuing Conversion**, renewing their baptismal commitment to Christ and His Church. In the coming weekend masses, 16 Catechumens and Candidates in our parish will be participating in **the Rite of Election** and **the Call to Continuing Conversion**. Please keep them in your prayer as they continue their Catechesis and Conversion for a long-life relationship with Jesus as part of our Catholic family.






Christ, heart of creation, united with all that suffers, help us contemplate honestly our lives. Through discernment, show us where our choices have harmed the earth and the poor.

Pause: Where did I hear and see creation's cry today?

Spirit of renewal, send us forth into action. Teach us to live humbly within creation and to respond with love and justice.

Pause: What is creation calling me to do today in response to creation's song and cry?

Each week, visit the Interactive Heart on our website <https://laudatosimovement.org/lent/>. And spend time with the weekly reflection. Then, return here to respond in prayer.

February 18. Ash Wednesday.

What has distracted my heart from what truly gives life, and how is God inviting me to return to the heart – His heart and my own?

Weekly gesture (prayer): Examine your ecological conscience and choose one simple practice to deepen your ecological spirituality. Each day, thank God for three natural resources you used today (water, food, air) and ask for the grace to care for them more responsibly.



150 Polish Celebration

An invitation to all Polish descendants to walk in the Taranaki Multi Ethnic Parade on Saturday March 7th down the Devon Street of New Plymouth on the Extravaganza Day.

In 1876, 150 years ago, the Ship Fritz Reuter arrived in New Zealand with families from Poland. You are invited to celebrate 150 years to honour your Polish ancestors.

There is a Polish Flag to carry and a placard to identify us as the descendants of the men and women from Poland who arrived 1876 to build the bridges for the road and railway line to Stratford, 150 years ago. These early Poles lived in Inglewood in punga huts and came with their love of God the Father and established the Catholic church in Inglewood. The men lived and worked in the bush cutting down the trees and clearing the land for the farms that we now have.

After the Parade please feel free to come to the race course to select the food you would like for lunch from the many stalls which will be preparing food from their different countries.


There are other stalls in the marquee where you will find the Polish stall.


