Holy Week begins with Palm Sunday. On this day, we celebrate the triumphant entry of Our Lord, Jesus Christ, into Jerusalem, riding a donkey. On that day, the people laid palms before Him, a gesture reserved for triumphant leaders. We celebrate this at Mass by

distributing palms. The palms are blessed at Mass. Eventually, these palms are returned to the Church where they are burnt and traditionally, their ashes are used at next year's Ash Wednesday services.

The next major event in Holy Week is Holy Thursday. On this day, Jesus celebrated the Passover feast with the disciples. We know this feast as the Last Supper - it was the first Mass. This is the night Jesus was betrayed by Judas and arrested. It is the night Jesus washed the feet of the disciples. The Last Supper is celebrated at every Mass, and in a special way on Holy Thursday, when parishioner's feet are washed. We will receive the holy oils blessed by Bishop John at the Chrism Mass.

After supper, Jesus went to the Mount of Olives and prayed. This event inspires our practice of Eucharistic Adoration, where we are invited to spend one hour in prayer with Jesus, truly present, in the Eucharist. We will do this at the end of Mass, on Holy Thursday by following the procession down to the Altar of Repose in the hall.

The next day is Good Friday, and on this day, we commemorate the trial and crucifixion of Jesus.

Holy week ends with the Easter Vigil. The night Jesus rose from the dead as Lord of all. It is his obedience to the Father that won us our salvation. This night we celebrate resurrection - the power that resurrection has over death. And all that this symbolises. At the Easter Vigil this year, we will baptise 8 adults, who will also celebrate Confirmation and first Eucharist. We will receive 6 people, who were baptised in another Christian church, into the Catholic faith and parish family. They will be Confirmed and receive the Eucharist for the first time. The Easter Vigil will begin at 7.00pm with the Easter fire outside the church. This is a great Mass and experience for those who are to be baptised and received. Everyone is warmly invited to participate in these liturgies and support our new family members at the Easter Vigil.

DIVINE MERCY CHAPLET is a devotion that was revealed by God to St Faustina in Cracow, Poland in the 1930s. During the pontificate of Pope John Paul II, St Faustina's countryman, the devotion was given a special place in the life of the church when he designated the Second Sunday of Easter as Divine Mercy Sunday. A novena leads up to this celebration. Brochures for the novena, which is a private novena, beginning Good Friday, are available in the church foyers.

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY DEVOTION: The Divine Mercy devotion will be held at Our Lady Help of Christians church Sunday 12 April at 2.30pm. There will be Rosary and Exposition followed by the Chaplet at 3.00pm. The Veneration of the Image will follow, finishing at approx. 3.15pm. If a priest is available Reconciliation will be celebrated during this time. Please come and learn about this devotion. Everyone is most welcome.

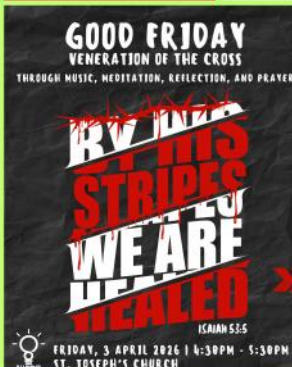

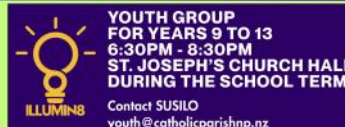
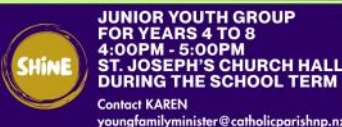

St Patrick's Celebration:

On Sunday 22nd March a large group of people attended 9.30am Mass at St Patrick's, Ōkato to celebrate 145 years of the church community and a belated opportunity to celebrate St Patrick's day. We were blessed with a wonderful day, with Mass being celebrated by Fr Tom joined by many of our families and those parishioners who have since moved from our area. Morning tea and fellowship followed Mass which was enjoyed by all who attended and followed an Irish theme with decorations and green sweets loved by the children.

In 1880 the design for a small church in Ōkato was completed by Fr Etienne Chastagnon. Once completed it was formally opened on 4 May 1881 and dedicated to St Patrick. By March 1886 a larger church had been built and was blessed and opened by Archbishop Redwood. This church still stands today. During the same year a two storied presbytery was opened next to the church to house Marist priests. Ōkato became the base for a permanent mission for the Taranaki Māori. For several years this was used but closed in 1927. In the early 1940's the Mission was re-opened but in 1947 a fire completely destroyed the Ōkato presbytery. In 1954 St Patrick's the main body of the building was extended which doubled the seating capacity of the church. Since then, the physical appearance of the church has remained the same and recently was uplifted with an external repaint.

Over the years St Patrick's has been part of the Opunake, New Plymouth and Pungarehu Parishes, returning to the Catholic Parish of New Plymouth - Te Parihi Katorika ki Ngamotu in 2015. St Patrick's church has witnessed 145yrs of prayers and tears within the warmth of its rimu walls, with many sermons, weddings, baptisms, first communions, confirmations and funerals, calling the people of Ōkato and the surrounding area. Currently we celebrate a weekly Vigil Mass on Saturday evenings at 6.00pm. We encourage you to join us, parking is not an issue and there is plenty of seating.

Thanks to Fr Simon who allowed us to change our Mass time for this occasion and who with Fr Sobin attended our celebration after their Sunday commitments. Thanks, Fr Tom, for celebrating this special day with your home St Patrick's community.
Thank all of those that came to support our St. Patrick's Day, and the 145 years Celebration of St. Patrick's Church on Sunday 22nd March.

We were very humbled to see you all there to celebrate Mass, and to share in the hospitality afterwards in the wonderful weather. Thank you to all who helped make this such a success. We greatly enjoyed having Nicola coming to play the organ and Emily to
